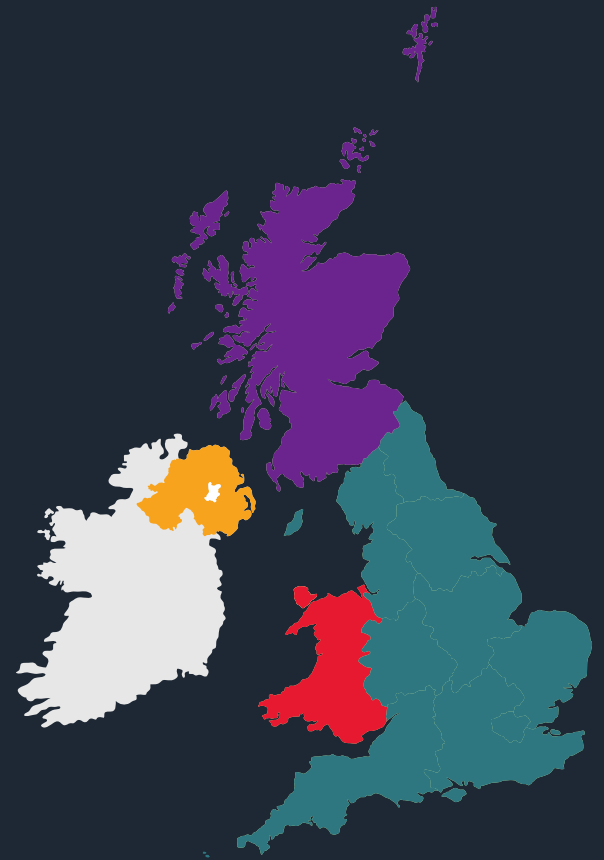

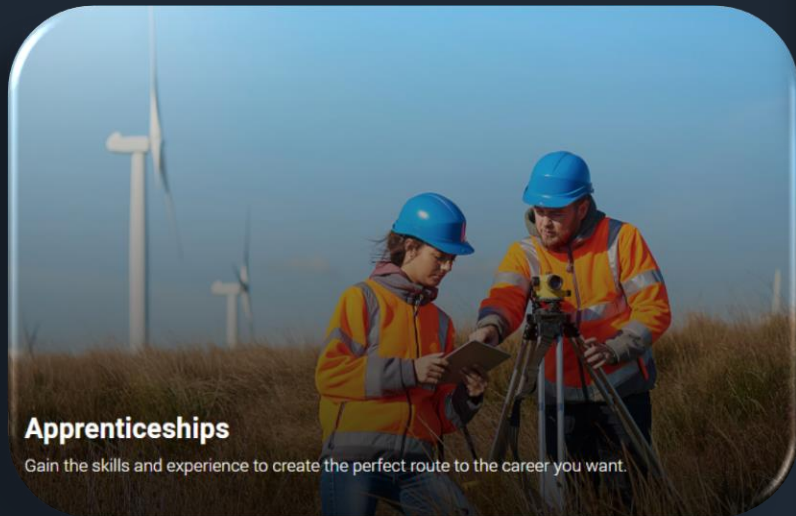

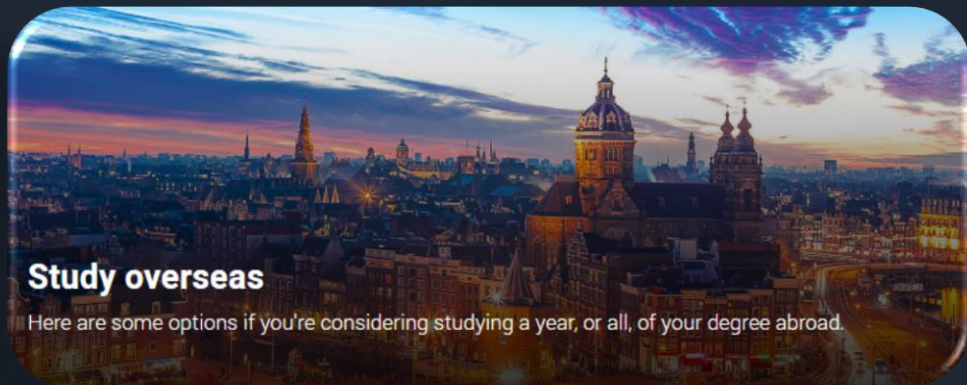

Apply – key facts



Application journey

- Application is entirely online.
- Maximum of five choices.
- Some restrictions:
 - A maximum of four choices for medicine, veterinary science/medicine, and dentistry.
 - Can only apply to either Oxford or Cambridge.
- Simple application cost:
 - One choice – £20.
 - Two to five choices – £25.
- Equal consideration if deadlines are met.
- Invisibility.

When to apply

MAY

Late May 2022 — Apply opens for 2023 entry

SEP

6th Sept 2022 — First day to submit applications

OCT

3rd Oct 2022 — deadline for Conservatoires – music
15 Oct 2022 — deadline for Oxford, Cambridge,
medicine, dentistry, or veterinary medicine/science

DEC

2nd Dec 2022 — school deadline for guaranteed
submission by deadline

JAN

15 Jan 2023 — deadline for undergraduate courses

Decision-making

An admissions tutor can make one of three decisions:

- unconditional
- conditional
- unsuccessful

Decision-making

You may also be asked to:

- attend an interview
- produce a portfolio
- take an admissions test

Your replies

Wait for decisions from all your choices, then choose one:

Firm If all conditions are met, this is where you'll be placed.

Insurance Usually lower conditions in case the firm conditions are not met.

All other offers must be declined at this point.

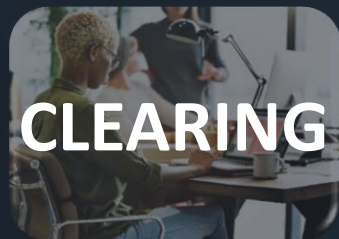
You don't have to have an insurance choice.

The 14-day cooling off period is in effect.

Other options



If you have used all five choices and have no offers, or have declined all offers, you could add Extra choices for consideration, one at a time.



If you have no offers, have not met the conditions of an offer, or applied after 30 June deadline.
