Choose 'Storm on the Island' or 'Before you were mine' (depending on your class). The poet allows us to imagine that we are part of the scene. To what extent do you agree with this statement. (20 marks)
08/04/19	Revise the Anthology poetry. Create mind maps linking the poems to the key themes. Create links between the poems and support these links by adding in quotations.
