

English Department Policy on feedback

Following a successful pilot study between September 2018 and February 2019, the whole school is trialling a new method of feedback. (The Trial guidelines are available under the Teaching and Learning section of this website.)

What is the purpose of the feedback we provide in the English Department?

- To celebrate and reward the work that students have produced
- To provide targets and the opportunities for improving work
- To monitor, evaluate and review students' current attainment, providing evidence for reporting
- To promote high expectations among learners and staff, in line with the School Development Plan
- To enable students to evaluate their own progress and independently set targets for progression

Principles which underpin our feedback policy are:

- Feedback is an essential part of effective teaching and learning.
- Feedback will support progress.
- Feedback will take many forms.
- Feedback will be regular.
- Students need dedicated lesson time to reflect and act upon the feedback given.
- Students' written corrections and responses to the feedback should be in purple.

The English Department has spent time developing approaches to feedback which work best for our subject specialism and these approaches will take many forms, including:

- Written feedback from the teacher
- Verbal feedback
- Self assessment
- Peer assessment
