

History Department Feedback Policy

1. Students will receive either written or oral feedback.
2. There are a variety of ways to assess student work, for example – whole class assessment, self-assessment, peer assessment, teacher assessment, discussions and knowledge tests.
3. At Key Stage 3, students will complete assessments at the end of each topic as well as an end of year examination.
4. At Key Stage 3, homework projects are assessed separately either by peer or teacher assessment.
5. At Key Stage 4, students will complete class notes where acknowledgement marking may be undertaken by the class teacher.
6. KS4 students will have a separate assessment book where exam questions will be completed and assessed using peer, self or teacher assessment.
7. Students will use purple pen to respond to feedback.
8. DIRT time will be given to allow students to respond to teacher or peer feedback.
9. Some work may be assessed purely on the basis of effort and the department uses these grades:

U	Unacceptable
