



Independent Learning



- We expect each learner to complete 7-9 hours independent learning for each of their respective subjects each fortnight.
- We are using independent learning broadly to cover the term homework and study period work in 6th Form.
- Independent learning will take the form of many different activities.
- Some independent learning will be set, but there is the expectation that learners will identify their

What does our 2 week timetable consist of?



- Each subject has 9 lessons a fortnight.
- Each learner has 9 directed learning sessions*.
- There is 1 PSHE lesson.
- There is 1 seminar (assembly) period.
- There are 2, optional, 'games' lessons.
- Opportunities for enrichment, such as EPQ*.
- This means learners are engaged for around 40-45 out of the 50 hours of the 2 week timetable.




Successful learners (**Breakthrough Learners**) score highly in the following areas:

<u>V</u>ision- Use <u>Unifrog</u> to see what routes are available, and the courses they are on are the correct ones for that course.

<u>Effort-</u> This is down to the learner, how are they using their study periods and completing independent learning.

<u>Systems-</u> Over the next half term our learners will develop systems, from note taking to ways teachers promote methods and systems on how to complete work.

<u>Practice-</u> Learners must regularly practice testing their knowledge and/ or skills from the start of 6th Form.
