Duke of Edinburgh Award

16 of the Year 10 students participating in this year's Bronze Duke of Edinburgh award have been offered the opportunity to complete their volunteering at Chester Zoo. Students have been working at weekends over a 12 week period, assisting the Zoo's volunteering and marketing teams to undertake a range of activities. These include working on campaign projects, answering visitor questions about conservation and providing information about popular animals on site.

During this time, the students have learned about many of the Zoo's conservation campaigns, and have focussed on these four: 'Sing for Songbirds', 'Illegal Wildlife Trade', 'Sustainable Palm Oil', and 'Wildlife Connections'. A key part of the volunteering is for students to develop their own projects to teach people about what they can to do help.



Recently, the Zoo celebrated Chester becoming the world's first sustainable palm oil city by hosting an event at the Storyhouse in Chester. The two students who chose to work on the 'Sustainable Palm Oil' project (Lisa and Eleanor) were invited to attend the event to help the Chester Zoo volunteer team to raise awareness of the campaign. The event was a great success and helped to highlight how people can get involved in the project by buying sustainable palm oil.

The volunteering comes to an end on 1st April, where students will present their campaign projects to the Chester Zoo team, friends and family.




A published alumna
