Dear Parents, Carers and Students

I hope you are all keeping well and coping with the many changes that we are facing at this time of great uncertainty.

Last Friday, we sent out letters to you all, explaining what our Continuation of Learning Plans (CoLPs) are from w/c 15 June for your child's year group. We have also emailed separately **years 10 and 12**, with information regarding their face-to-face sessions in school from June 15. I thought it would therefore be useful for you to know what is happening with all of our year groups, so that you have a fuller picture, and to explain the rationale behind our plans.

In accordance with the government publication 'Actions for schools during the coronavirus outbreak' from June 15, we will be inviting year 10 and 12 students 'for some face-to-face support from their teachers, to supplement their remote education':

We are asking secondary schools to offer this face-to-face support to supplement the remote education of year 10 and year 12 pupils, which should remain the predominant mode of education during this term for pupils in these year groups.

Consequently, over the past few weeks we have been very busy working out what this face-to-face provision should look like with our year 10 and 12 students here at Upton High, and also reviewing our online learning provision for **all** year groups.

Our Continuation of Learning Plans (CoLPs) have been designed to enhance the structure, interaction and tracking of our online learning schedule; every lesson will require the students to upload a response (in some format) and this will be acknowledged by the teacher. We will be trialling Google Meet lessons with our year 12s initially, but we are aiming to get the other year groups up and running on Google Meet as soon as possible.

As I am sure you can imagine, given the size of our school community, this has been a complex process.

I am pleased to say that we have had our proposals and Risk Assessments scrutinised and approved by our Full Governing Body.

Last week, we also welcomed back all of our staff to consult on our proposals and to support them with the changes they will be facing, either as face-to-face teachers of year 10 and 12 and/or as providers of remote learning to the rest of our community.

Part of this has included training all staff in the use of **Google Meet**, which is our chosen, live, video-conferencing platform and part of Google Classrooms, used extensively already across our school. Given the specific, educational focus of Google Meet, and the work they have done in responding to the needs of schools in particular, we are certain that our previous safeguarding concerns have now been addressed. Consequently we will be using Google Meet with year 12 students in the first instance **from w/c 15 June** but envisage that it will be quite rapidly rolled out to all year groups, to supplement their new, online Continuation of Learning Plans.

Please note that the remote education of year 10 and year 12 students, via our Continuation of Learning Plans, remains the predominant mode of education during this term.
