Fairtrade Fortnight

Our Fairtrade Fortnight started with assemblies by Second Deputy Headteacher Mr Keegan for every year group to inform them of events, lessons and reasons why we should buy Fairtrade. He spoke about how the pupils could influence their parent's spending and change their buying habits. Pupils were asked to finish the fortnight with an own clothes day on the last Friday in return for bringing in a Fairtrade item. The ELFs (E-Learning facilitators on the iPad) made posters to advertise events throughout the weeks and the children helped by serving in the Fairtrade tuck shop, The Hut, every day.

Fairtrade lessons were held in every subject, with competitions set up for; ART – best design of Fairtrade pyjamas and socks; DT/FOOD – best Fairtrade breakfast plate; ICT - Fairtrade poster competition on the iPad; ENGLISH – Acrostic Fairtrade poem. A Fairtrade Quiz was written on Socrative for the iPad and the teachers used it in PLaN (Pastoral, Literacy and Numeracy) time at lunchtime for KS3. A Fairtrade Hamper raffle was organised.

Throughout the fortnight the canteen provided Fairtrade breakfast grab bags, containing a Fairtrade; drink, banana and muffin. Fairtrade reps helped collect the food in throughout the final week. Mr Keegan dressed up as a banana (even when teaching) all day to raise money. For non-uniform day, this March, the pupils donated hundreds of items of Fairtrade Food which went to local care homes and the local Foodbank.

Members of the Fairtrade team delivered Fairtrade food (6 boxes) to Orchard

Manor Care Home, it had 26 boxes of tea, 20 tubs of hot chocolate, 6 bags of sugar, 7pks of biscuits, 10 jars of coffee, 10 multipacks of Kit Kat, 15 boxes of Maltesers, 5 pouches of Maltesers, a box of chocolates, 2 jars of jam, a bottle of wine, and loads of Fairtrade chocolate bars. Lesley Catt, activities co-ordinator, is going to make up raffle prizes for Easter with the chocolate, to make money for the home and the resident's trips. She was amazed at what the students had achieved and she said it was rare to have so much donated. She also said 'you don't realise how much this is going to help with activities.'

The Fairtrade team visited Wealstone Care Home, Upton, with another 6 boxes, residents were excited with the amount of food the students had donated last year and were even more surprised this year. We handed over 12 boxes of Fairtrade food, with even more chocolate, for the local Foodbank just before Easter.

Throughout Fairtrade Fortnight the pupils renewed their awareness of fairtrade, the poor and poverty, but had fun doing it.

Make It Enterprising Challenge

On 23rd March 2016, three Year 9 teams competed against local schools in the Year 9 Manufacturing Institute's Make It Enterprising Challenge sponsored by Essar.

Each challenge sees students from 12 schools forming their own companies and taking on one of a number of job roles from managing director, finance director, sales and marketing manager through to manufacturing manager, design engineer, logistics manager and quality controller.

During the course of the day teams compete against each other to discover who can create the best product and make the most profit. They have to complete a series of key tasks including; building a prototype of their product, creating financial plans and producing a marketing campaign within budget. When the teams have completed these key tasks they pitch their idea to a Dragon's Den line-up of manufacturing leaders and a get the chance to be crowned the winning team and go through to our annual Grand Final.



Upton-by-Chester High School (Team 3—Lauren, Liam, Benedict, Charlie, Lucy, Dominika, Daniel and Alfie) were crowned overall winners of the event. Amy (not pictured) also won an individual award recognising her outstanding leadership skills.

As winners of the event, Upton-by-Chester High School have been invited to undertake a site visit of Essar's Stanlow manufacturing facility. They will also compete in the Grand Final in June 2016.




Top 10 Environmental Issues Report
