## **National Careers Week 2024**

National Careers Week 2024 is the 4<sup>th</sup> to the 8<sup>th</sup> of March. This is a one-week celebration of career guidance. We have a number of activities going on in school which are outlined below, but we also want to provide you with resources so that you can discuss careers with your child at home.

## In School

- Learners will learn throughout the week about careers within curriculum areas.
- Each year group will have an assembly from different guest speakers about their respective careers and sector.
- Thursday in the Hub sees our next Careers Breakfast instalment and we are delighted to welcome our speaker to talk about the career of a 'forensic scientist'.
- Thursday will also see Year 12 learners visiting Bentley, for a 'Girls into Bentley' workshop.
- Friday we have a number of Year 8 learners visiting Chester Zoo, and Year 10 learners visiting the Storyhouse.
- Staff members within the school community are also sharing the jobs they have held that have led us to the role we hold today, and the skills we have obtained.
- All learners within school are having a careers lesson to launch NCW 2024.


